Requires Improvement	<p>The student's behaviour, effort and attitude in lessons has been of concern on a number of occasions which has negatively affected their learning experience within the group.</p> <p>The student can arrive unprepared for some lessons, often arriving without the correct equipment, books and kit as appropriate.</p> <p>Some expectations relating to classwork have not been met.</p> <p>On occasions, the student has been unresponsive to teacher advice and instruction.</p> <p>These behaviours are contributing to the student failing to meet their target grade.</p>	<p>The breadth, depth and quality of work produced independently is below the expected standard, reducing the understanding in the subject.</p> <p>Some homework may not have been produced even after an extension being given.</p> <p>More than one deadline has been missed since the last report.</p>
Unacceptable	<p>The student's behaviour, effort and attitude in lessons is of significant concern, seriously affecting their learning experience and causing disruption within the group.</p> <p>The student often arrives unprepared for lessons, often arriving without the correct equipment, books and kit as appropriate.</p> <p>Expectations relating to classwork are regularly not met.</p> <p>The student is generally unresponsive to teacher advice and instruction.</p> <p>These behaviours are contributing to the student failing to meet their target grade.</p>	<p>The breadth, depth and quality of work produced independently is well below expectation, seriously affecting the level of understanding in the subject.</p> <p>Homework is regularly not completed.</p> <p>Deadlines have been frequently missed since the last report.</p>
