Bournside Eco Club plant a new school orchard



The Bournside Eco Club have recently completed the planting of an orchard on the school's site, thanks to the donation of 22 fruit trees from the Gloucestershire Orchard Trust (GOT).

Andy and David from GOT joined the planting session to guide students in planting the first trees. GOT is the leading charity dedicated to the conservation of traditional orchards in Gloucestershire. Traditional orchards are a valuable resource and have unique ecological,

cultural, genetic, heritage and landscape value that we need to look after.

The orchard, which will have eating apples, pears and crab apples, will be looked after by the Club as part of their regular activities and it is hoped it will become fully established over the coming years for future students to continue to look after. Thank you!
