

# Uniform and Equipment Guidance (Years 7 – 11) Academic Year 2023-2024

At Cheltenham Bournside School we expect the highest standards from our students, this includes their personal presentation and preparation for the school day. Our uniform gives our school its identity and we expect our students to wear it with pride. To maintain these standards, this guide outlines our expectations to ensure that our students feel part of our community, are equipped and ready to learn, and make the best impression to everyone they meet.


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## Uniform

#### **Compulsory uniform**

Important: Please mark every item of clothing with the owner's name.

- Branded Bournside blazer with school badge
- Branded Bournside full-length/tailored trousers with school badge or navy pleated skirt
- White regular or fitted shirt which must button at the neck. Short sleeves shirts are permitted but capped sleeves are prohibited.
- Black/navy/dark socks or black/natural plain tights. White sports socks are only permitted for PE
- Plain black or dark brown shoes with a low heel. Platforms, boots, trainers and ballet pumps without a hard-based sole are prohibited.
- Respective Cheltenham Bournside School House tie (please see colours below):



#### **Optional uniform**

• Plain navy v-neck jumper (logos are not permitted). Any other jumper is not permitted.

#### **Physical Education compulsory items**

On the days that a student has a PE lesson they are expected to bring their PE kit in a school bag and change in and out of their PE kit in school. Students should arrive every day in full school uniform.

- Branded Bournside navy polo shirt with school badge (girls)
- Branded Bournside white polo shirt with school badge and branded Bournside rugby top (boys)
- Navy shorts or skorts
- Branded Bournside navy sports socks (outdoor)

- White sports socks (indoor)
- Trainers (any colour) with non-marking soles
- Rugby/football boots (boys). Studs must conform to Rugby Football Union safety standards.
- Shin pads
- Gum shield.

#### Physical education optional items

- Astro-boots for use on Astro-Turf
- Rugby/football boots (girls). Studs must conform to Rugby Football Union safety standards.
- Navy/black tracksuit bottoms
- Branded Bournside full zip sports jacket with school badge
- Branded Bournside navy sports leggings
- Base layer (black, white, or navy)
- A mid-layer for warmth. This can be a plain navy/black fleece type garment that can be worn under the Bournside sports top. Branding not required.
- White cricket trousers necessary if in the school cricket team
- White cricket jumper necessary if in the school cricket team.

#### **Outdoor garments**

- All outdoor layers, including overcoats, jumpers, fleeces, hats, scarves, and gloves must be removed on entry to the school building and must not be worn during lessons.
- Hooded sweatshirts or 'hoodies' are prohibited at school and must be removed at the gate.
- Prohibited items will be confiscated for collection at the end of the school day.

#### Hairstyles

- Hairstyles must be neat and tidy and hair accessories should be discreet and removable
- Long hair must be tied back for PE, Technology, and Science lessons
- The use of hair dye to achieve unnatural colours or combinations is not permitted
- Hair should not be excessively short (minimum grade 1) or cut with lines or patterns
- After holidays, students should return to school with acceptable hairstyles. Please allow adequate time for colours or patterns to grow out.

#### Jewellery

- No jewellery is to be worn in school, except for one wristwatch and a maximum of two plain removable metal-coloured small stud earrings, worn in the lower ear lobe
- Necklaces, bracelets and rings are not permitted
- Any student who arrives in school with an item that is not permitted will be asked to remove it before being allowed into lessons and will have that item confiscated. The confiscated item will be handed to Student Reception and can be collected at the end of the school day in line with the 'collection of confiscated items procedure.'

• Refusal to remove any prohibited items will result in a Level 3 'refusal' on our Ladder of Consequences – please see our Behaviour Policy.

#### Make-up

• Any make-up worn must be discreet

• Nail varnish, fake tan, acrylic nails/extensions, and false eye lashes/extensions are not allowed in school. If a student presents in school with such items, they will be given 48-hours to remove them. If a student refuses to remove these items, it will result in a Level 3 'refusal' on our Ladder of Consequences - please see our Behaviour Policy.

#### **Collection of confiscated items**

Any prohibited items that have been confiscated will be labelled and handed to school reception. Each item that is confiscated will result in a negative uniform point logged against the student's behaviour record. Items will be returned to the student using the following protocol:

- 1st offence: item placed at Student Reception and student may collect from 3:15pm
- 2nd offence: item placed at Student Reception and member of Senior Leadership Team to release to student
- 3rd offence: item placed at Student Reception and parent/carer expected to collect when they are able

• Any further uniform infringement will result in a parent/carer needing to collect the confiscated item and the student will serve a school detention for each incident.

# Equipment

We expect all students to arrive at school every day with the necessary equipment to enable them to have a successful day of learning. All items to be kept in an appropriate school bag.

#### **Compulsory equipment items**

• An appropriate school bag of adequate size to carry the books and items required in school (small fashion-style handbags are not permitted)

- A pencil-case
  - Our 'magnificent 7' (items 1-6 can be purchased at school):
    - 1. Pens (minimum 2)
    - 2. Pencils (minimum 2)
    - 3. Ruler
    - 4. Rubber
    - 5. Sharpener
    - 6. Planner (given to students replacements must be purchased)
    - 7. Reading book
- Calculator (Casio FX83 recommended as this is required for Maths examinations)
- Drinks bottle
- Helmet if cycling to school.

#### **Optional equipment items**

Additional items you may find useful include; an iPad, colouring pencils, highlighters pens, mathematical equipment, and subject-specific resources, e.g. cooking ingredients and musical equipment.

#### **Personal belongings**

Students and parents are advised that expensive items such as high-quality mobile phones, apple and android watches, Fitbits, etc should **not** be brought into school. If they are brought in, then they are at the owner's own risk. The school cannot be held responsible for any damage or loss to personal property whilst on school site.

#### **Additional information**

In cases where medical reasons require a modification to the uniform and equipment expectations, notice on letterheaded paper from a medical professional must be addressed to the student's Head of House detailing the reason, and specifically stating the amendment that needs consideration, and the duration the amendment is needed for. The school will look to support any reasonable requests. To maintain our high standards of uniform, a consistency check will take place in each morning at the start of period 1. Where uniform and equipment fail to adhere to these guidelines, a sanction will be issued in-line with our Behaviour Policy until the matter is resolved. Prohibited items of clothing will be confiscated and where possible an alternative will be provided for that school day from our pastoral

support team to allow a student to access their lessons. Refusal to remove prohibited items will result in a level 3 sanction.

These expectations should be read in conjunction with the school <u>Behaviour Policy</u>. Please see our Uniform Guidance to further support you when purchasing school uniform and equipment. With respect to hair styles, make up and jewellery, Bournside reserves the right to decide what is discreet and appropriate for the school environment.

If your personal circumstances or finances mean that you are unable to purchase the full school uniform and equipment, please email <u>admin@bournside.gloucs.sch.uk</u> and we will endeavour to help. The following systems can be used to access support:

Uniform grant	Low-income families are entitled to apply for a uniform grant to support them with costs. Please email admin@bournside.gloucs.sch.uk
shop	We hold a limited stock of 'nearly new' uniform that has been donated by parents or purchased through our pastoral team. Parents/carers are able to book an appointment via the <u>main</u> <u>office</u> to look through our current stock. Purchase is via donation. All donations will be put back into the Uniform Grant to support others who require assistance in the future.
- online group	We are lucky to have a team of parents and volunteers who run a quality <u>second hand uniform system online</u> . Although not affiliated with the school, this Facebook page may be a useful site to access.
