School Clubs

Art Club KS3: The time and space to work on personal art projects in our Art studios.

Board Game Club: Hang out and enjoy board games and card games with new friends, every Wednesday after school in the Library.

Chess Club: Chess has so much to offer students in terms of intellectual and creative development. Learn a new skill or improve your game in a friendly, informal atmosphere after school on Mondays.

Coding Club: Come along if you're interested in computers and writing code. Whether you're a beginner or you've already got some programming experience, come to G25 after school every Wednesday and learn to code using KODU, Scratch or even Python!

Community Gardening Club: Our Club maintains the Bournside Community Garden within Hatherley Park. Every Thursday after school, we plan and plant new flowers, weed, deadhead and prune to look after the space. A fantastic way to give something back to your local community!
