Level 2	Whole school detention, 45 minutes, logged on PAM – level 2 Confiscation until parents collect, logged on PAM – level 2 <i>Sixth Form sanction</i>	Referral from a lesson to department parking/repeated incidents of level 1 behaviour after interventions have taken place Smoking (including e-cigarettes) on school premises or in uniform (1 st offence) Minor scuffles/repeated name-calling Incident verified as bullying behaviour (also to trigger a letter home warning of possible higher level sanction) Targets not met whilst on report Failure to attend punctuality detention Three lates in a week Mobile technology used in a teacher's lesson without teacher's permission after a level 1 intervention <i>Two lates in a week to lessons</i>

Level 6	Permanent Exclusion	Repeated incidents/continued poor behaviour after fixed term exclusion Criminal behaviour Bringing an offensive weapon in school and/or possessing it (<i>Offensive Weapons</i> are defined in the Prevention of Crime Act 1953 as 'any article made or adapted for causing injury to the person; or intended by the person having it with him for such use by him') Possessing or supplying an illegal drug Physically attacking or injuring a member of staff Fight or violence against another student leading to serious harm Aggravated sexual, homophobic or racial assault Arson Deliberate activation of the school fire alarm without reasonable justification
